Combined, these two guides should keep you out of trouble when tackling this project. Before sliding the levers onto the bars, you'll need to peel back the rubber hoods to gain access to the T25 Torx nut that tightens the clamp. A number of rubber nibs hold everything in place, so make sure to prise them out carefully before peeling the hood back using a spoke head or small hooking device. They need to be pulled back far enough from the front and rear to gain access to the soft and vulnerable alloy Torx nut. The older mark II hoods are mercifully easier to deal with and require only a 5mm Allen key, but go easy on them anyway. Release enough clamp tension to allow the lever body to slide easily past any sharp bends in bars. Don't force it if it gets stuck, because the inner edges can crack. You might have to completely unscrew the clamp, particularly on bars with multiple anatomic bends. Make sure the T25 key is fully inserted; a heavy coating of factory threadlock makes clamp nut removal a challenge, but stick with it. The newest levers come with a shim for longer reach and bigger hands; place this between the bar and lever body before final positioning. It's unlikely these will see much use, though, since the normal reach is considerable. Straddle the bike and get everything even. Ensure the levers are high enough to benefit from a comfortable hood position created by a transition from the bar to the tops. The lever body is shaped to fit at the most acute bar section. If you position it over the broader portion of the bend lower down, where the bar radius is too large, the composite body can be damaged when tightened. Using a torque wrench, if you have one, torque to about 10Nm. On the new 11speeds, pull the cable down as near to its leading end as possible as pictured; any kinks left in the cable can then be trimmed off when finishing. All irregularities or kinks put into the inner when threading it through will adversely affect shifting accuracy.

It's an important friction-reducing element, but one that's easily lost if the tip of the cable catches its edge while you're working. Also, watch out for the pale yellow Teon insert in the previous step; it's irreplaceable, so don't let it fall out of the body and disappear between the oorboards. Route cables with either both at the front, or the brake at the front and gear at the back. No ferrules are required going into the mark III body. Mark IIs do require them, but don't try jamming a 5mm brake ferrule into the 4mm gear opening. So, wrap the end with a few turns of stiff tape before cutting. Use a medium file to square off the ends while held firmly between your fingers. Follow with a poking device to ensure the Teon liner isn't blocking the end. We've mentioned that Campy mark II levers require a ferrule into the bodies, but the new mark IIIs don't, so the cut has got to be clean and square. It's imperative to get the lengths right in order to accommodate turning the bars. Any cable outers cut too short will affect performance; the outer and inner can bind and actuate brakes, especially when manoeuvring at low speed. Ensure it's lined up to provide as straight a cable run as possible on the way to the derailleurs. It must be completely seated against the bottom bracket shell, with no gaps. Make sure the radius of the shell matches the curve of the guide. A large guide meant for a carbon or aluminium frame will sabotage your shifting on a steel frame with a small bottom bracket shell, and vice versa. The high gear small cog screw is on the right of the rear mech, while the large cog screw is on the left. For the front mech, high gear big ring is the bottom screw, while low small ring is the top one. Get behind the bike and examine the top jockey wheel it should stop directly below the large and small cogs without being able to push past these settings, but give it a good shove or tug to make sure.

The gap between the lower edge of the front changer cage over the teeth on the big ring should be about 3mm. Setting stops is critical to prevent overshifting into spokes or other damage. After setting your stop screws, set the rear derailleur onto the smallest cog and move the shifter for the first click; the chain should shift to the second cog without hesitation. Turn the adjuster barrel counterclockwise about half a turn if it doesn't and try again. Repeat for the rest of the gears. If overshifting occurs, slacken the cable by turning the barrel clockwise. For the chainset, set the limit screws for good shifting without any chain dropoff. Note that the final outer click of the front shifter, on the furthest outward cage position, has a tendency to slip if the cable and stop screw are too tight. Place separate pieces of tape vertically on either side of the lever to conceal the band. With taping completed, reinsert all the little rubber nibs in their respective holes on the body. This will ensure the hoods don't drift, which could interfere with the operation of the return lever mechanism. Ensure everything is tight, and take the bike to a safe, traffic-free zone for a test ride. Slam on the brakes and work the shifters. Make sure you can lock up the rear wheel and that the chain doesn't drop off when shifting. Readjust as required using the barrel adjusters on the brakes and gears. Were assuming that at some point youve ridden a multispeed bicycle like a 10speed that was equipped with derailleurs and shift levers, and youre familiar with the basics of how to shift. You shift according to feel. As the terrain changes you operate the shifters to make it easier or harder to pedal depending on what feels right to you. Also, bikes arent like cars. In other words, theres no need to start off in first, shift into second as you pick up speed, then third, etc. On a bicycle, you find the best gear for where youre riding by shifting until it feels right to you. With experience this gets easy and becomes almost second nature. You have to be pedaling in order to shift, however, its important to ease the pressure off the pedals when you shift. This is easy when youre heading downhill or rolling along the flats, however, approaching an uphill youll need to anticipate the need to shift, pedal a few times so you build up a little speed, and you can then ease off the pedal pressure and shift into an easier gear. In general, you operate one shift lever at a time, and shift across one cog or chainring at a time some shifting systems let you shift across multiple cogs if needed. Move

the right shifter to make small adjustments in how easy and hard it is to pedal. It controls shifts across the cogs on the rear wheel and there are usually 8, 9 or 10 cogs meaning relatively small steps and changes in effort with each shift. It shifts across the 2 or 3 chainrings on the crankset what the pedals are attached to, which vary significantly in size and make a large difference in pedaling effort with each shift. In these positions an extreme angle is set up, which can lead to noise and accelerated wear. While nothing will break if you shift into these extreme gears, its best to avoid them as much as possible.

Unless you ride where its flat and you dont need to shift very much, you should shift a lot to keep yourself pedaling easily and comfortably no matter what the terrains like. Think of yourself as the bikes engine and try to maintain a steady pedaling speed with your legs and change gears anytime your legs feel like theyre being slowed down or spinning too rapidly. Good cyclists are always shifting to keep their effort steady and easy and you should, too. And remember that you cant hurt the bike by shifting it. If you have any questions about all of this, just let us know and well explain on the phone or demonstrate here in the shop. Shifting is fun! Shifting the right lever see the 6 illustrations below controls the rear derailleur and moves the chain onto the different cogs in the rear. Notice that there are 2 levers you operate to shift, the main lever thats just behind the brake lever and that you push with your fingers, and a secondary buttonlike lever located on the inside of the body of the lever at the top, which you push with your thumb. In both positions its easy to reach and operate the 2 shift levers, the main lever just behind the brake lever and the buttonlike top lever near your thumb. When you feel like its too hard to pedal and want to shift into an easier gear, you push inward on the main lever. It clicks with each push and this moves the rear derailleur, which in turn shifts the chain onto the next larger rear cog making it easier to pedal. You can click the lever again to shift into an easier gear, and so on. You can also push farther on the lever to shift up more than one cog at a time if you like, When you feel like its too easy to pedal and youd like a harder gear, you push the buttonlike lever on the inside top of the lever down with your thumb. It clicks with each push and this moves the rear derailleur, which in turn shifts the chain onto the next smaller rear cog making it harder to pedal.

You can repeat as needed or you can push the lever further to shift down several cogs at once. Shifting the left lever see the 6 illustrations below controls the front derailleur and moves the chain onto the different chainrings. You move these levers separately, pushing the main lever inward toward the center of the bike and the secondary lever down with your thumb as follows The left lever operates like the right lever, with 2 levers, a main one pushed with your fingers and a secondary buttonlike lever located on the inside of the lever near the top and pushed with your thumb. Because there are only 2 or 3 chainrings, and they vary in size so much, the levers must be pushed a little further than the right lever to complete a shift. Like the right lever, you can shift with your hand resting on the top of the lever and when youre on the lower part of the bars, too. When you need to make it a lot harder to pedal as you will when you crest a hill and start going a lot faster down the other side, you push inward on the large lever to shift the chain onto a larger chainring making it a good bit harder to pedal. You can do this in a single long sweep of the lever, or two or more shorter motions. When you need to make it a lot easier to pedal as you will when you come to uphill, pushing the buttonlike lever down with your thumb shifts the front derailleur in the opposite direction and moves the chain onto a smaller chainring, which makes it a lot easier to pedal the bike. Thats all there is to it. Now, with a little practice youll be shifting up a storm and having more fun than ever. Remember, if you have any questions about shifting or anything else cycling, just drop by. Were always happy to help. And, please keep in mind, that if your derailleurs are out of adjustment and your bicycle isnt shifting properly any more were happy to help you with the problem and get your bike shifting like a champ again. It doesn't seem as accurate anymore either, sometimes slipping. You can hear the clicks aren't as pronounced and seem soft. I've cleaned and relubed it, but still doesn't seem to help. They're pretty old, I think from the early 2000s, I bought them from someone who had them on a Bianchi. Does anyone have experience rebuilding these. Is it worth rebuilding and are there still parts available. I'd rather rebuild these if I can. Not only because it may be more economical, but I hate waste and can't see just dumping these. Thanks! Trek 1000 current build project You should be able to find a new ratchet somewhere to replace it. It's not the easiest job in the world. I've talked to LBS mechanics that didn't have the willingness or knowledge to do the job. There are coil springs that have to be wound just right and inserted at the correct angle, but the job is doable.
